
# RECRUITMENT & RETENTION




# **Community Connections Coordinator**

### **Get Connected Program**

Get Connected provides a regular social call from a VCHSS volunteer to an older adult living alone.



The program offers:

- A free, weekly connection with a trained volunteer.
- A friendly, pleasant conversation with someone who knows your name on topics of mutual interest.
- Volunteers are matched to participants based on common interests. Times are arranged between participants and volunteers.

The UnCommon Room Project, funded by Continuing Care Innovation Pilot funds, is a partnership between VCHSS, Cape Breton Housing Authority, and the Victoria County Senior Safety Program. The program delivers weekly visits by our facilitators, Wendy and Yvonne, to common rooms in Housing Nova Scotia senior housing complexes in Victoria County. If you find them in your Common Room, you may experience fun, connection, and learning. Look for them weekly in Baddeck, Iona, Ingonish, and Dingwall.
